Introduction

The Rainbow Society of Alberta

A Child. A Wish. A Dream Come True!

Since 1986, The Rainbow Society of Alberta has been dedicated to making dreams come true for Alberta children between the ages of 3 and 18 diagnosed with a life-threatening or chronic illness. As of December 31, 2009, we have proudly fulfilled **796** special dreams for as many special children and their families at a total cost of just under \$4,000,000.00. We look forward to celebrating our 25th anniversary in 2011.

Our Mission

To grant wishes to Alberta children between the ages of 3 and 18 who have been diagnosed with a chronic or life-threatening illness.

Our Objectives

- a) That the wish be in the best interest of the child;
- b) That the wish be fulfilled outside of a hospital environment whenever possible and that it includes the immediate family;
- c) That the privacy and dignity of the child and family is, at all times, preserved and respected.

Wish Program Criteria

To be eligible for our program, children must be:

- Alberta residents;
- Aged 3 to 18 years (not yet reached their 18th birthday);
- Diagnosed with a life-threatening or chronic illness.

We define chronic to mean a medical condition, which severely impacts and restricts the child's activities of daily living. The impact and restrictions may result from a variety of factors including, but not limited to, recurrent hospital stays, use of oxygen and/or ventilator machines, the need to use a wheelchair for mobility, high doses of medication, or a considerable degree of medical intervention.

Ours is a program of HOPE ... whether it's HOPE for tomorrow, HOPE for a miracle, or HOPE for a cure - maintaining HOPE is fundamental.

Governing Body & Structure

Volunteer Board of Directors

The Rainbow Society of Alberta is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors which includes Directors of Fundraising, Communications, Legal, Finance, Business Development and Planned Giving, plus Directors of Northern Alberta and Southern Alberta. Two Directors also serve as President and Vice-President for a two year term.

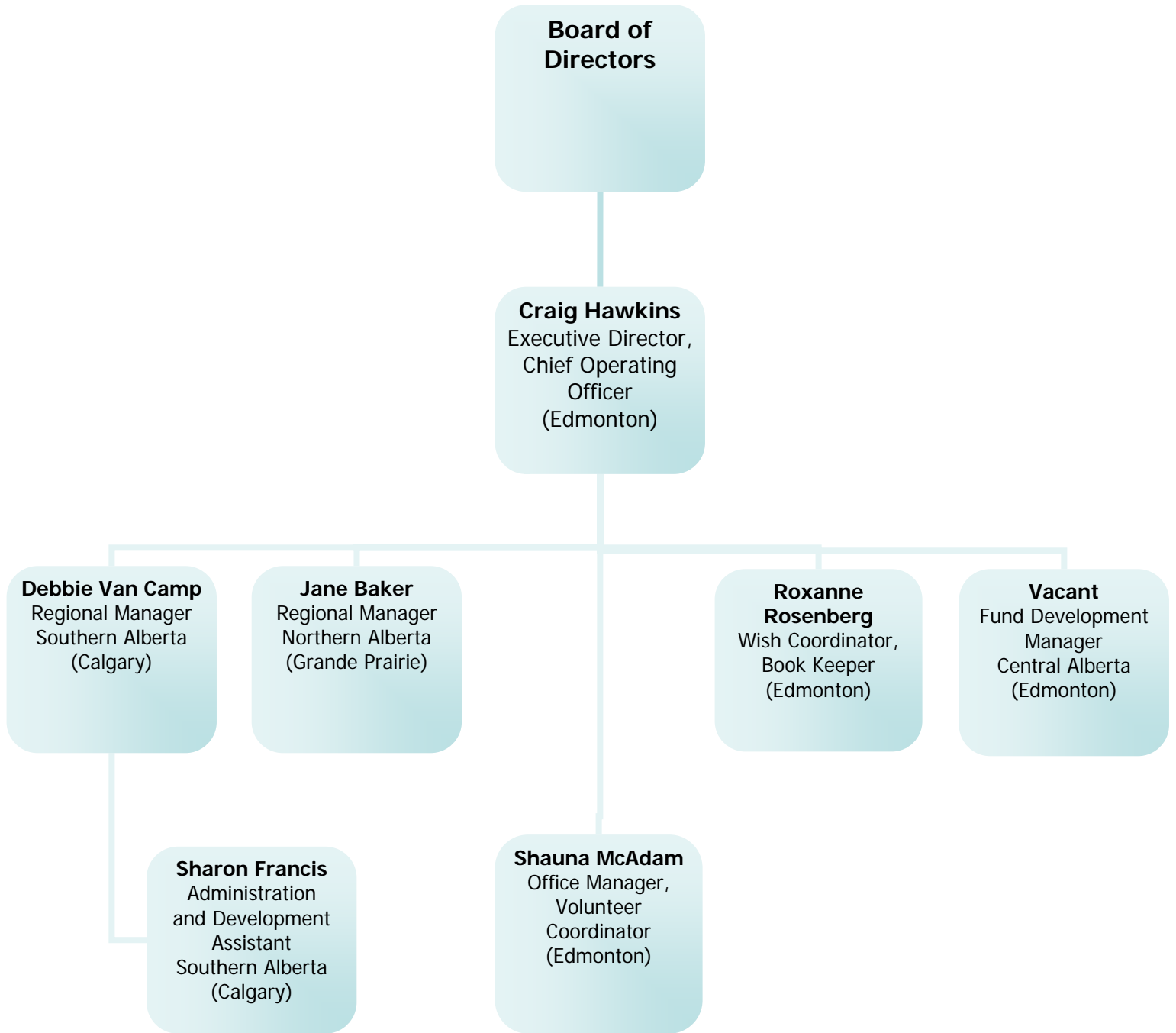
Our head office is located in Edmonton. The Executive Director is the senior staff member.

Activities & Accomplishments

Memberships

Annual memberships are available for \$10 per year and include a membership card, lapel pin, a vote at the Annual General Meeting and receipt of our Quarterly Newsletter. It is from our membership that we fill vacant Board or Committee positions.

Donations/ Memoriums

Since we are not government-funded at any level, we rely solely on private and corporate donations, donations received in memorium and proceeds raised through various fundraising activities. We are not a United Way member agency.

All donations are tax deductible under Canada Revenue Agency guidelines.

Fundraising

We produce fundraisers in the three main regions of the province (Grande Prairie, Edmonton and Calgary throughout the year. we are also fortunate to have many third party fundraisers contribute funds to the society.

As a result, we are able to meet our charitable objective of granting 63 wishes in 2009 at an average cost of \$5,900.00 each.
